(2) Please note in FY 2014 a total of \$400,000 was transferred to the Kansas Biodiesel Fuel Producer Incentive Fund due to an error in the bill posting. A total of \$200,000 was transferred back to the SHF in FY 2015 to correct the error. The number shown in this chart reflects the net result of this action and the legislative intent for this transfer.

(3) Please note the number shown for the FY 2015 transfer to KHP is net of a \$142,906 transferred back to the SHF under 2015 SB 4. In addition, the number shown for the FY 2017 KHP transfer is net of \$65,387 transferred back from KHP under 2017 HB 2052. Furthermore, the number shown for FY 2019 KHP transfer is net of \$46,741 transferred back from KHP under 2019 SB 25.

(4) The Eisenhower Legacy Transportation Program (2020 House Sub. for SB 173) enacted during the 2020 Session became effective with FY 2021. Prior years reflect the Transportation Works for Kansas (T-Works) Program.
