Notice of Hearing on proposed Administrative Regulation, K.A.R. 66-15-1

A public hearing will be conducted at 10:30 am on Friday, December 13, 2019 at the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions, 900 SW Jackson, Suite 507, Topeka, Kansas 66612, to consider the adoption of a proposed new regulation, K.A.R. 66-15-1, regarding the fees charged by the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulation. All interested parties may submit comments prior to the hearing to Larry G. Karns, Executive Director, at the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions' above address, or via email to KSBTPadmin@ks.gov. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views, orally or in writing, concerning the proposed regulation during the public hearing. In order to provide all parties with an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentations to ten minutes.

Copies of the proposed regulation as well as the economic impact statement for the proposed regulation may be obtained from the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions, 900 SW Jackson, Suite 507, Topeka, Kansas 66612, by contacting Larry G. Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation to be considered and the economic impact statement for the regulation in an

A summary of the proposed new regulation and the economic impact of the regulation follows:

K.A.R. 66-15-1 states the fees historically charged and collected by the KSBTP and establishes two new fees required by the KSA 74-7009 (a)(6) for the untimely renewal of a license or certificate of authorization pursuant to K.S.A. 74-7025 and by KSA 74-7009 (a)(7) for the return of an inactive license to active practice, or for the reinstatement of a cancelled license. The maximum fees for these services allowed by KSA 74-7009 (a) (6) and (a) (7) is not more than \$200.00. The Board proposes to set the appropriate fee for each of these services at \$20.00. The proposed regulation is not anticipated to have a significant economic impact as the maximum cost of the new proposed fees to an individual licensee or an entity with a certificate of authority is limited to \$20.00 and the fees for untimely renewals can be avoided by timely renewal during renewal period.

The health, safety, property and welfare of the people of Kansas is protected by licensing qualified individual is to practice in areas of technical professions. The legislature by statute,

K.S.A. 74-7001 et seq, has set the maximum technical professions licensing fees. This regulation states the current fees set by the Board of Technical Professions within those statutory maximums and establishes the amount of two fees which were not previously charged but which are required to be charged and collected by the board by K.S.A 74-7009. These additional charges are \$20.00 each for K.A.R. 66-15-1 (f) late fee for the untimely renewal of a license or certificate of authorization and K.A.R. 66-15-1 (g) return from inactive practice to active practice license. The regulation impacts the architects, engineers, geologists, surveyors and landscape architects and related business entities licensed by the Board.

The economic effect, including a detailed quantification of implementation and compliance costs, on the specific businesses, sectors, public utility ratepayers, individual is, and local governments that would be affected by the proposed rule and regulation and on the state economy as a whole;

The regulation sets fees for license applications, renewals, late fees, reinstatements, replacements, and certifications. The initial fees range from \$0.00 to \$250.00. Once licensed the renewal fee is \$70.00 every two years for individuals and \$95.00 every two years for businesses

C. Businesses that would be directly affected by the proposed rule and regulation;

Architects, engineers, geologists, land surveyors and landscape architects and related business entities.

D. Benefits of the proposed rule(s) and regulation(s) compared to the costs;

The regulation sets fees within the statutory maximums set by the legislature.
