NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED PERMANENT REGULATIONS

K.A.R. 102-1-13; K.A.R. 102-2-3; K.A.R. 102-3-2; K.A.R. 102-4-2; K.A.R. 102-5-2; K.A.R. 102-7-2

A public hearing will be conducted by the staff of the Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board on Tuesday, Qctober 3, 2023, from 10:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. in the BSRB conference room at 700 SW Harrison St. Ste. 420, Topeka, to consider proposed changes to administrative regulations for several professions regulated by the BSRB. There is metered parking all around the Eisenhower State Office Building. The public entrance is on the north side of the building. To ensure that there is adequate space for public attendees, all individuals wishing to attend the hearing must notify David Fye, Executive Director for the BSRB, no later than two business days prior to the hearing by sending an e-mail to david.fye@ks.gov. At the hearing on October 3, all interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally. To give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes or less, depending on the number of attendees that wish to speak. Oral comments will be recorded by staff members of the BSRB and summarized for the Board at the next full Board meeting when changes or adoption of the regulations are considered by the Board.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation to participate in the hearing should be made at least five business days in advance of the hearing by contacting Leslie Allen, Assistant Director, at 785-296-3240 or leslie.allen@ks.gov.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing constitutes a public comment period for purposes of receiving written public comments on the proposed amendments. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to David B. Fye, JD, Executive Director, Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board, 700 SW Harrison St. Ste. 420, Topeka, KS 66603. E-mail comments may be directed to david.fye@ks.gov.

A copy of the full text of the regulations and the economic impact statements may be reviewed or obtained at the board office. They are also available on the board website at ksbsrb.ks.gov under proposed regulations. The board does not have a less costly or less intrusive method for achieving the stated purpose of these regulations. The regulations that will be considered during the regulatory hearing portion of the meeting are as follows:

Summary: These proposed changes to regulations primarily involve setting the amounts of fees for new license types created by the enactment of 2023 Sub. for SB 131, including: Community-Based Licenses; Temporary Reinstatement Licenses; Temporary Candidacy Bachelor's and Master's Social Work Licenses; Student Temporary Addiction Counselor Licenses; and establishing an expedited application fee. The proposed changes also include lowering certain temporary license fees and setting a PSYPACT Home State Privilege to Practice Fee and a fee to become a Board-Approved Supervisor for the professions of professional counseling and marriage and family therapy.

Economic impact: The net economic impact is unknown, as decreases to some existing fees will lead to a decrease in revenue for the BSRB; creation of some new license types are anticipated to serve as alternatives to existing licenses, so there would be no change in revenue; and some newly created licenses will lead to an increase in revenue, but most of these license types have no comparisons, so it is unknown how many individuals would pursue those new license types.

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Section I

Brief description of the proposed rule(s) and regulation(s).

These proposed rule and regulation changes all involve creation of new fees or modification of existing fees, primarily corresponding to two actions: (1) an action by the Board to lower certain temporary license fees in January 2023 and (2) fees for new license types corresponding to the enactment of 2023 Sub. for SB 131. Proposed fee changes also include adding the PSYPACT Home State Privilege to Practice Fee for psychologists practicing under PSYPACT authorized by K.S.A. 74-5353 and adding a fee to apply to become a board-approved supervisor for the professional counseling and marriage and family therapy professions.

In K.A.R. 102-1-13, proposed fees for psychologists were modified to:

- (1) Add a Community-Based Licensed Psychology license fee (Sub. for SB 131);
- (2) Add a Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact (PSYPACT) Home State Privilege to Practice Fee;
- (3) Add a Reinstatement Temporary License Fee for this new license type (Sub. for SB 131);
- (4) Lower the Temporary License Fee and the renewal of such license type from \$100 to \$50;
- (5) Strike obsolete references to "15-day permit," as the permit timeframe has been increased to 30-days;
- (6) Add an Expedited Application Fee (Sub. for SB 131);

- (2) Add new Temporary Candidacy Baccalaureate and Master's Social Work License Fees and Fees for Extension for these newly created license types (Sub. for SB 131);
- (3) Strike obsolete references to "15-day permit," as the permit timeframe has been increased to 30-days;
- (4) Add an Expedited Application Fee of \$100 (Sub. for SB 131);

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In K.A.R. 102-5-2, proposed fees for marriage and family therapists were modified to:

- (2) Add a Community-Based Licensed license fee for this newly created license type (Sub. for SB 131);
- (3) Add a Reinstatement Temporary License Fee for this new license type (Sub. for SB 131);
- (4) Lower the Temporary License Fee from \$150 to \$50;
- (5) Strike obsolete references to "15-day permit," as the permit timeframe has been increased to 30-days;
- (6) Add new language that fee to reinstate a license that has been expired for over one year equals the renewal fee, rather than the renewal fee and a reinstatement fee;
- (7) Add an Expedited Application Fee of \$100 (Sub. for SB 131).

In K.A.R. 102-7-2, proposed fees for addiction counselors were modified to:

- (1) Add a Reinstatement Temporary License Fee for this new license type (Sub. for SB 131);
- (2) Lower the Temporary License Fee from \$75 to \$50;
- (3) Strike obsolete references to "15-day permit," as the permit timeframe has been increased to 30-days;
- (4) Add fee for new Student Temporary Addiction Counselor License and renewal of such license;

- (6) Add an Expedited Application Fee of \$100 (Sub. for SB 131).

Most fee creations are being introduced in combination with enactment of Sub. for SB 131, which created several new license types. The proposed rule and regulations changes on the fees will allow the agency to issue licenses at several new levels, which will enhance business activities by allowing more individuals to become licensed an employed as mental health professionals.

Certain businesses employing mental health professionals would be able to hire a wider range of applicants.

The businesses that would be affected include businesses that employee mental health professionals who are licensed by the BSRB. These fee creations and modifications should go hand-in-hand with creation of new license types, which will help more mental health professionals enter the workforce.

The benefits of creating new license types and modifying certain fees outweigh the costs of holding the public hearing on the proposed changes, printing the proposed rule changes in the Kansas Register, and the loss in revenue to the BSRB by lowering certain temporary license fees.

The estimate on revenue and expenditures is described below by type of modification:

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- (1) Lower Temporary License Fees to \$50 (Agency analysis) in the most recent completed fiscal year, the BSRB issued 328 total Temporary Licenses. Of this total, 167 Temporary Licenses were in professions whose Temporary License fee was already set at \$50. Forty-nine Temporary Licenses were issued for the marriage and family therapy profession, so the decrease from \$150 to \$50 would mean a decrease in yearly revenue of approximately \$4,900. Forty-six Temporary Licenses were for the master's level psychology profession, so the decrease from \$100 to \$50 would mean a decrease in yearly revenue of approximately \$2,300. Fifty-five combined Temporary Licenses were issued for bachelor's and master's addiction counseling, so the decrease from \$75 to \$50 would mean a decrease in yearly revenue of approximately \$1,375. Eleven Temporary Licenses were issued for the licensed psychology profession, so the decrease from \$100 to \$50 would mean a decrease in yearly revenue of approximately \$550. Overall, the lowering of the fees for Temporary Licenses would be estimated to lead to a decrease in revenue for the BSRB of approximately \$9,125.
- (2) Add New Community-Based License Fee for Licensed Psychology, Social Work, Professional Counseling, Master's Level Psychology, and Marriage and Family Therapy (Agency analysis) These new license types were not requested by the agency, but were added to 2023 Sub. for SB 131 during the committee process. They are anticipated to be an alternative to the existing traditional Temporary License. The Board recommended the fee be set at the same amount as the existing Temporary License, so the agency estimates there will be a net-zero impact on revenue (losing revenue on fewer Temporary Licenses, but gaining equal revenue on Community-Based Licenses).
- (4) Add New 6-Month Reinstatement Temporary License Fee (Agency analysis) It is unknown how many individuals may seek this newly created license type, as this group of individuals would not have been able to reinstatement their licenses or obtain alternate licenses previously. Therefore, a revenue estimate cannot be calculated, though based on the \$25 fee, it is anticipated that there would be a small increase in yearly revenue for the agency.
- (5) Decrease Fees to Reinstatement Licenses if Previous Licenses were Expired for At Least One Year (Agency analysis) A revenue estimate cannot be made for this item. While it is anticipated the agency will experience a decrease in revenue from some individuals no longer needing to pay the reinstatement fee, it is anticipated that there will be an increase in previous licensees wishing to reinstate their licenses, so the net result may be zero or a different amount that cannot currently be estimated.
- (6) Add Expedited Application Fee (Agency analysis) Per enacted 2023 Sub. for SB 131, the Board received authority to create an expedited application process in rules and regulations and the Board is working to create this process. The agency did not request the introduction of this process in legislation, but it was added as a committee modification. To the agency's knowledge, a similar model does not exist in any other states for comparison. Without knowing how many individuals will choose to pay this optional fee, it is unclear of the amount of increase in revenue the BSRB will see related to this fee. In the most recent completed fiscal year, the BSRB issued 1,536 permanent licenses and 97 out-of-state temporary permits. If approximately 5% of these individuals had paid the \$100 fee for an expedited application, it would have increased agency revenue by \$8,165. If approximately 10% of these individuals had paid the \$100 fee, it would have led to an increase in revenue of \$16,330. Due to a lack of information on comparable models in other states or the desire for this model, the agency cannot estimate what increase in revenue is likely once the process has been implemented.
- (7) Add New Temporary Candidacy License Fee for Bachelor's and Master's Social Work (Agency analysis) in FY 2023, the agency received approximately five applications from students who received their education from programs in "Candidacy for Accreditation," however the year before, the BSRB received approximately 35 applications from students whose programs were in "Candidacy for Accreditation." It is also unknown how many applicants may have avoided applying

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for licensure in Kansas, that now may apply for licensure due to this new process. Using an average of 20 applicants per year, it is estimated that there may be an increase in revenue of \$1,000 per year. (8) Add New Student Temporary Addiction Counselor License Fee – (Agency analysis) The BSRB currently does not offer any student-licenses, so this new license type has no equivalent comparisons to estimate revenue. The agency has heard positive comments concerning the desire to create a student license, so the agency anticipates that the creation of this license type will lead to an increase in revenue, however the specific amount cannot be estimated at this time.

(9) Add Board-Approved Supervisor Application Fee for Professional Counseling and Marriage and Family Therapy professions – (Agency analysis) The BSRB receives an average of 3.5 applications for board-approved supervisors per month in the professions of professional counseling and marriage and family therapy. At this rate, the \$20 fee to new applicants to become board-approved supervisors would amount to an increase in revenue of approximately \$840 per year. (10) Add Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact (PSYPACT) Home State Privilege to Practice Fee – (Agency analysis) 2021 SB 170 added Kansas to a limited multi-state compact for licensed psychologists who choose to apply to the compact commission for a privilege to practice under the compact. Under this compact, the BSRB is charged a yearly assessment of \$10 per homestate licensee who chooses to practice under the compact. Revenue for a privilege to practice goes to the compact commission, not the BSRB. The authorizing legislation included authority for the BSRB to charge a fee, up to \$25, at the time of 2-year licensure or renewal. There was optimism that the compact commission would pass a rule change to pass the yearly \$10 assessment onto licensees, rather than on the BSRB, but this did not occur. At the conclusion of calendar year 2022, the BSRB paid the compact commission an assessment cost of \$820 and the amount is anticipated to be closer to \$1,000 at the end of calendar year 2023. The implementation of this fee is anticipated to lead to an increase in yearly revenue of \$1,250, though most of this revenue will be offset by the yearly assessment to the BSRB.

Concerning the long-range economic impact, it is anticipated that there will be an increase in the number of individuals seeking a student temporary addiction counseling license, as this new license type becomes more well-known. It is also anticipated that there will be an increase in applicants seeking to pay the Expedited Application Fee in future years, once that process has been created.
