STATE GENERAL FUND (SGF) RECEIPTS

July through May, FY 2021

Total receipts through May of FY 2021 were \$626.1 million, or 8.4 percent, above the estimate. The component of SGF receipts from taxes only was \$600.7 million, or 8.1 percent, above the estimate. This is the second monthly receipts memo using the April 20th consensus revenue estimates that increased the FY 2021 estimates by \$319.8 million.

Seven tax sources were above the estimate by more than \$1.0 million dollars and no tax source fell below the estimate by more than \$1.0 million. Those tax **sources** are bolded in the attached table.

Individual income tax receipts are continuing to **exceed** expectations for the year and the revised estimate with receipts **\$457.2 million**, or 12.2 percent, above the estimate. While state receipts exceeded expectations by noteworthy margins in several categories, the majority of the month's surplus came in balance due payments from individual income taxpayers. Kansas conformed to the federally-delayed deadline of May 17 for individuals to file income tax returns and pay any tax owed. Accordingly, the excess receipts does reflect 2020 taxable income of Kansas taxpayers being substantially higher than was anticipated. Some portion of the excess receipts may be due to uncertain timing of the impact on receipts of federal tax law changes from December 2020 and March 2021.

Corporation income is **above** the year-to-date estimate by **\$54.2 million** and continues to **outperform** the current estimate (\$24.8 million for May-only receipts) due to both strong corporate estimated and payment receipts for the year. Similar to the individual income tax receipts, the timing of the Paycheck Protection Program expense deductions is an uncertainty for corporation income tax.

Sales tax exceeded the year-to-date estimate by **\$53.3 million**, or 2.4 percent, and the May monthly estimate by **\$32.8 million**, or 16.8 percent, with continued strong receipts. **Compensating use** tax **receipts increased** by **\$27.7 million**, or 5.3 percent (36.0 percent for May-only receipts). This appears to reflect increased spending of federal stimulus payments.

Transfers into the SGF **exceeded** the estimate by **\$20.0 million**, or 24.8 percent, due to Coronavirus Response Fund and State Water Plan Fund transfers in HB 2007 that were enacted after the consensus revenue estimate.

This report excludes a deposit to the SGF which totals \$900.0 million pursuant to issuance of a Certificate of Indebtedness. The Certificate will be discharged prior to the end of the fiscal year.

All data provided in the Report comes from the U.S. Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) and the Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA). A link to the data source for each indicator can be found under the respective graph. The report provides graphs for the economic indicators outlined below (subject to change):

Nominal (current-dollar) Quarterly GDP Growth, U.S. and Kansas — The market value of all goods and services produced by labor and property within a geographic area, regardless of nationality.

Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) — A measure of the average change over time in the prices paid by urban consumers for a market basket of consumer goods and services.

Seasonally adjusted Unemployment Rates, U.S. and Kansas — The percentage of individuals who are unemployed, have actively looked for work in the prior four weeks, and are available to work

- Average weekly hours and earnings for each month of the current and prior years
- Year-over-year percent change in average weekly hours, average hourly earnings, and average hourly wage


QUARTERLY ECONOMIC INIDICATORS 2021 Q1


Monthly CPI-U (Not Seasonally Adjusted)





12-Month Percent Changes in Unemployment Rate



Kansas Private Sector Average Hourly Wage




